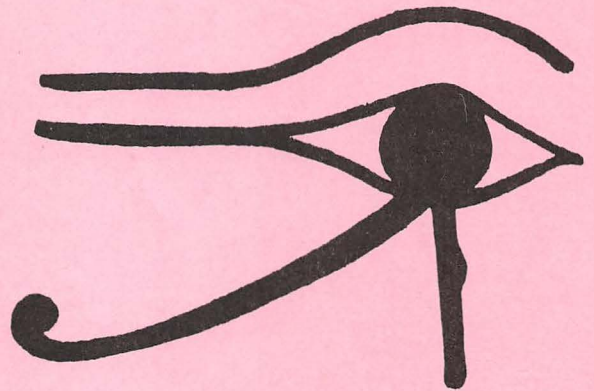

I became aware of his name when I first joined the Circle in 1972 or 1973, he was the person who was always being quoted when queries arose and his word was considered law. He was the one who could always give the answer to any question re the stamps or postal history of Egypt.

I became personally acquainted with Peter when he was in the U.K. some time in the late 1970's on a sabbatical year, and since then of course, we have become good friends.

Peter is still regarded by many of us as the fount of all knowledge, he has won many Gold Medals at International Exhibitions, and perhaps would have won more had the Judges been more aware of their subjects. He has recently completed a massive book of Egypt Philately, and I think we are all eagerly awaiting its publication. Since the days of Byam, the publication of an authoritative work on Egypt was a prime goal of the Circle, with the intention that many members should co-operate in its preparation. I am afraid that during my own term as Chairman, the matter was put very much on the back burner and it has needed the urgency and dedication of Peter Smith to take up the challenge on his own and see it through.

As to his Presidency during the past 21 years, all I can say is that he has always been there to give advice and encouragement. Any letter I have written concerning Circle or Philatelic matters has always been answered quickly and in great detail. We can only hope that we shall still be able to refer to him when the need arises.

Finally, it gives me great pleasure on behalf of the Circle to present you with this small momento as a token of our appreciation and sincere thanks for all the help and guidance you have given us over the years.

Query Corner

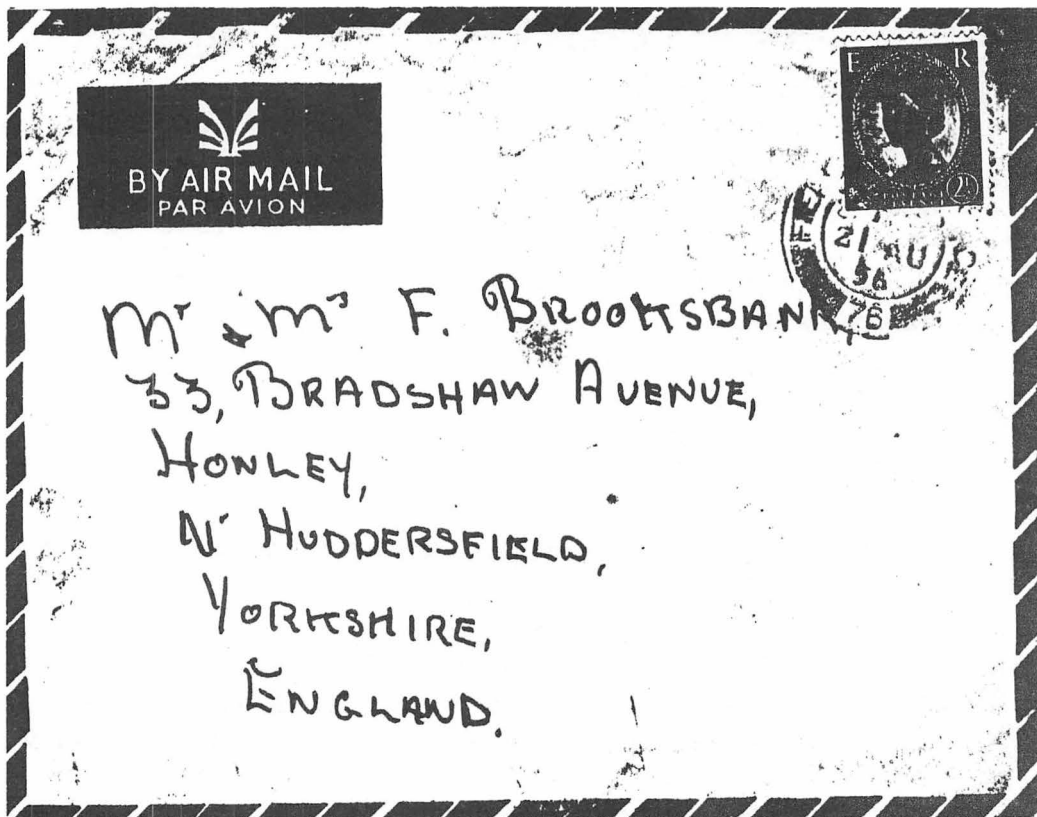

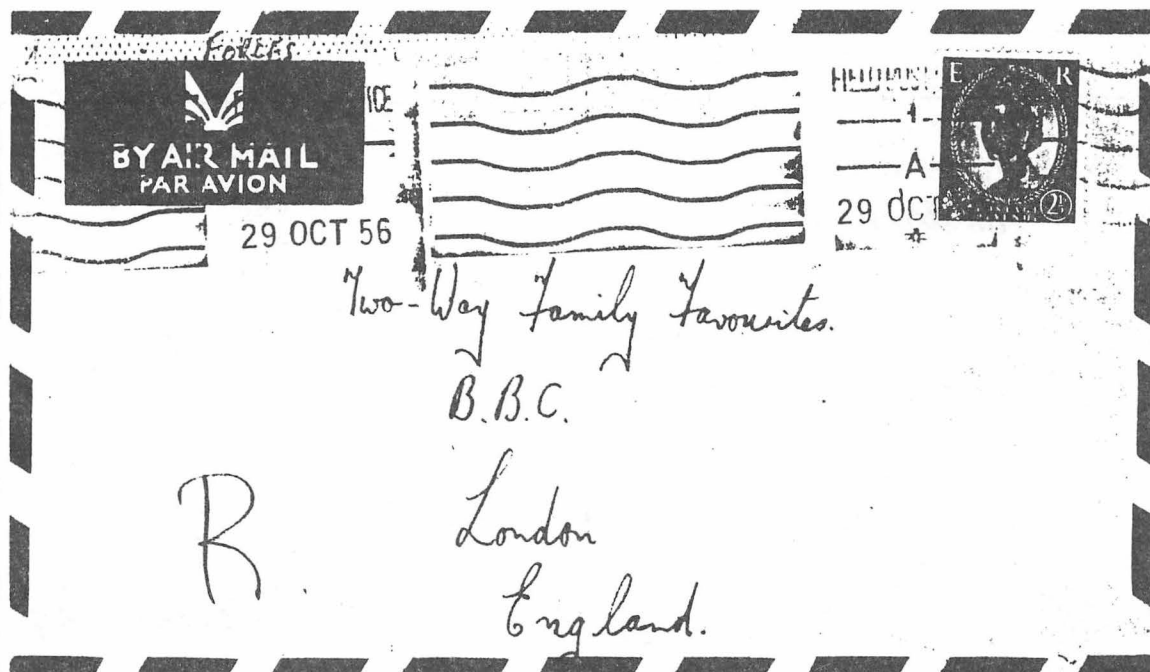
On July 26 1956 Col. Gamal Nasser, President of Egypt retaliated against the western democracies for having withdrawn their commitment to build the Aswan Dam by announcing that he would nationalise the Suez Canal Company. By the 31st July Great Britain and France had started to assemble a large invasion force, mostly in Malta.



Cover from BFPO 76 Mukateer Malta. 21 Au 56

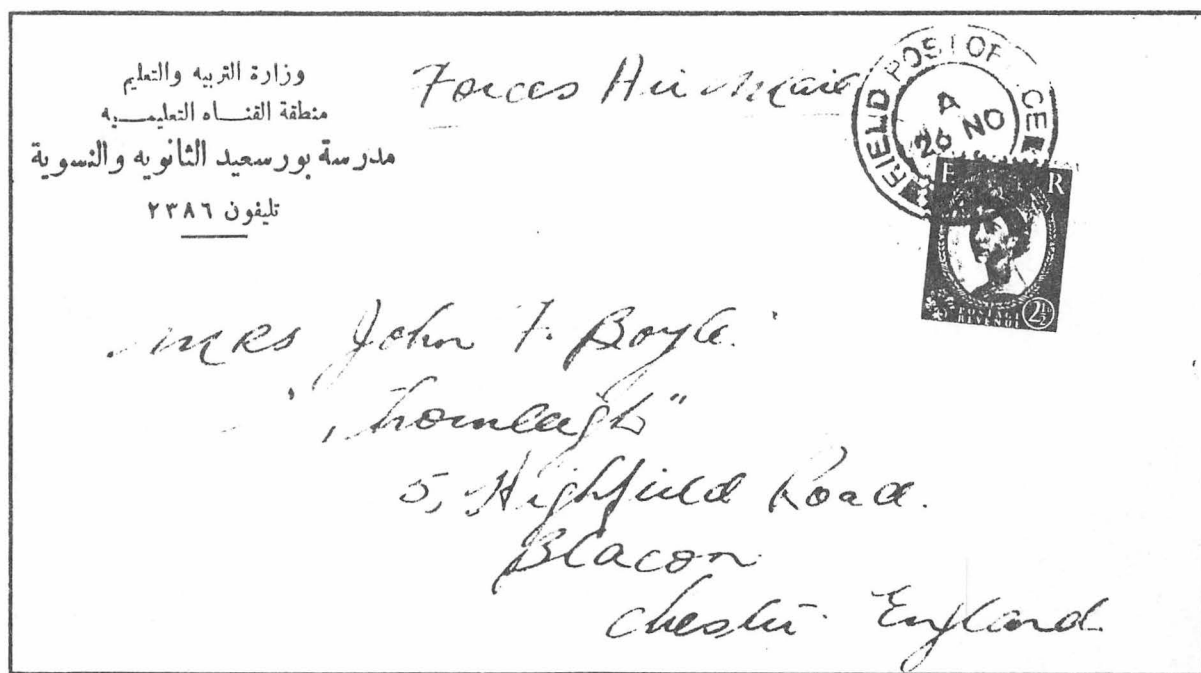
Various conferences in London and at the United Nations in New York tried to find a solution acceptable to all.

On the 29th October, Israeli forces launched a sudden attack in the Gaza Strip and Sinai Peninsula, joined next day by Britain and France.

On November 4th the UN General Assembly passed a resolution 57:0 ordering an immediate ceasefire and the immediate creation of a peace keeping force. By 22nd December all foreign troops on Egyptian soil had been replaced by United Nations Forces.



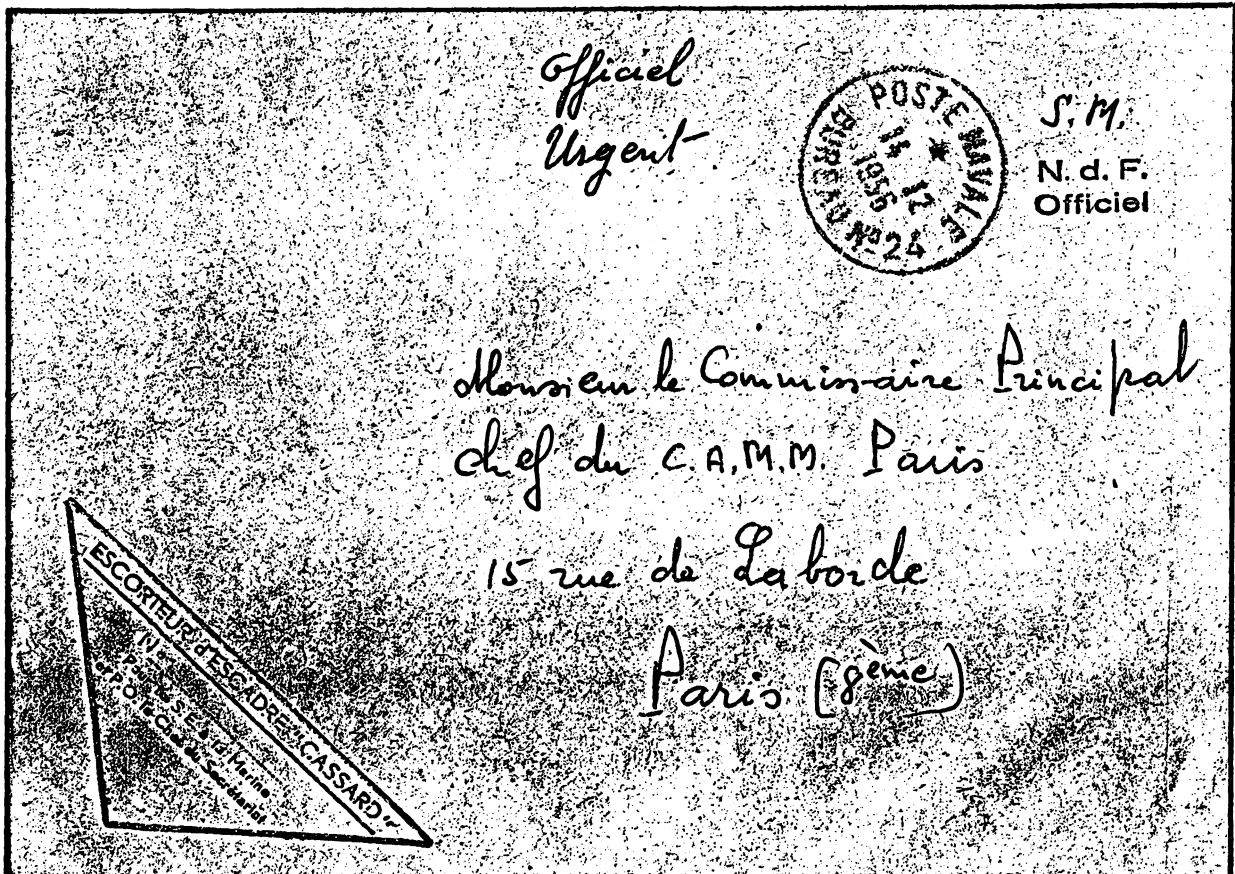
Cover from FPO 443 Suez The inscription is from a girls school in Port Said

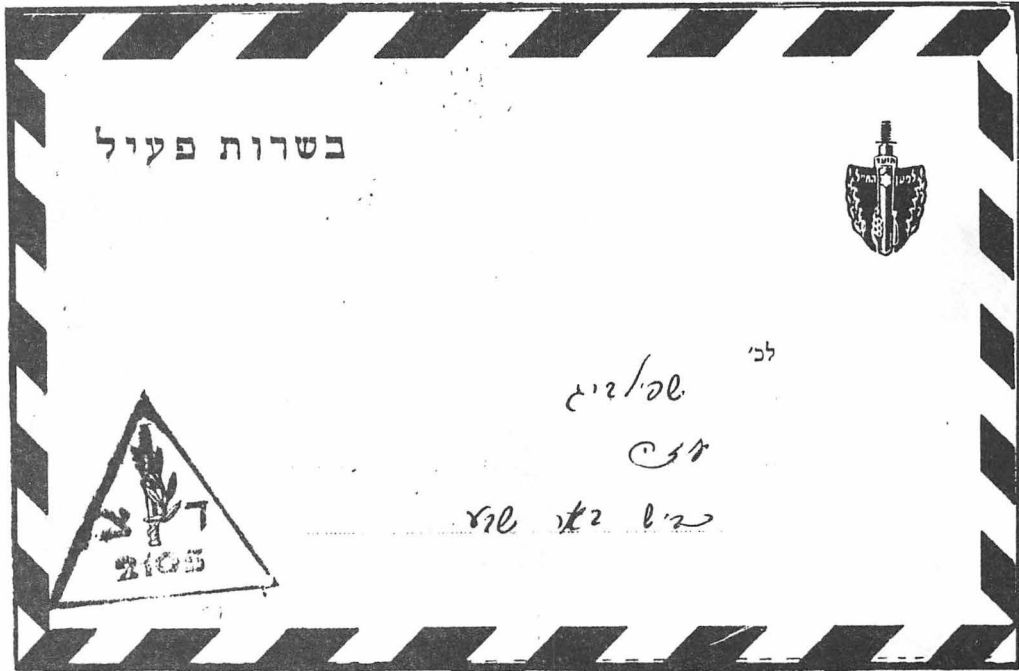

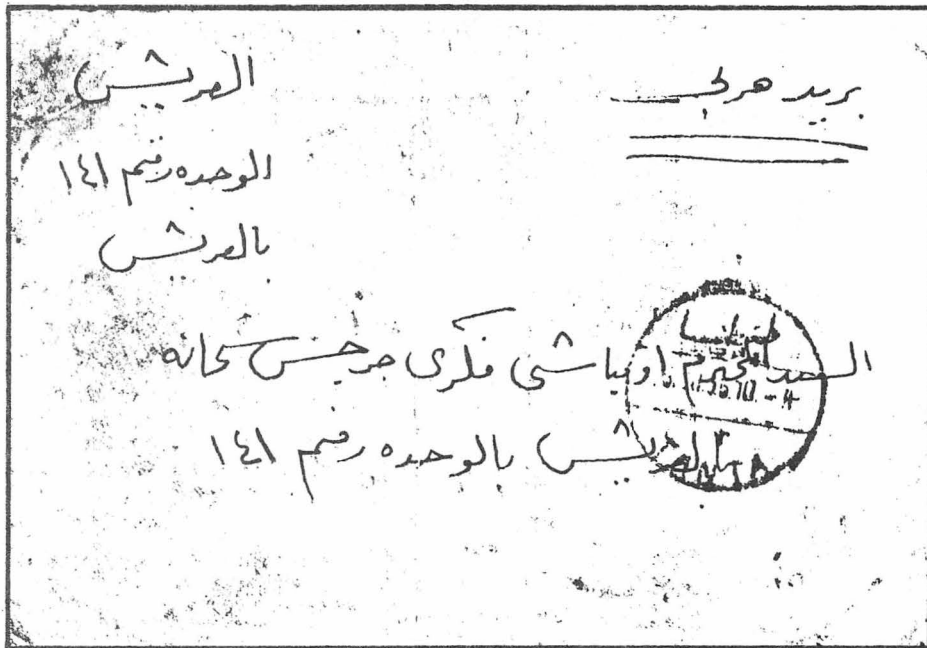

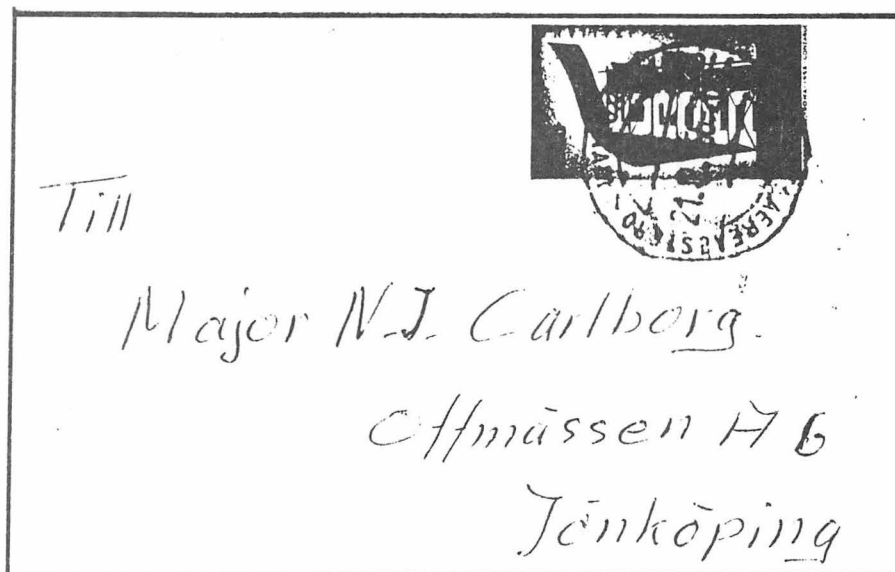
The United Nations Contingent.

The United Nations Force consisted of some 3700 troops. They were drawn from a number of countries and were put under the Command of General Burns. He arrived to take up his position in Egypt on the 12th December 1956 .



Cutting from a newspaper showing the General and some Collegues arriving at Kantara. The envelope was posted 3.1.57 at Naples and received a 'Posted out of course I.S.' and the English stamps were cancelled at London I.S. where the registration label was attached.

In the early days mail was posted from Italy. . . General Burns took command at Port Said on the 22nd December 1956 having come from Italy. Below is a Swedish cover posted from Naples to a Major in Jonköping on 21.12.56



The Swedish Contingent.

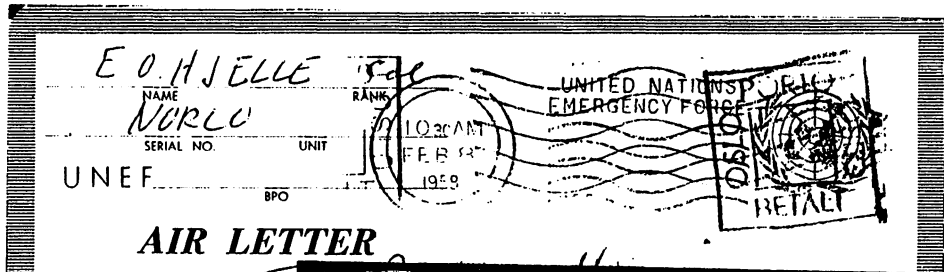
Normal Swedish soliders envelope dated 28.1.58 Svenska-Battalion - Egypten.

This was for homeward mail. A stamp was included under the flap which could be used for the reply to the soldier. The second cover shows such a usage.

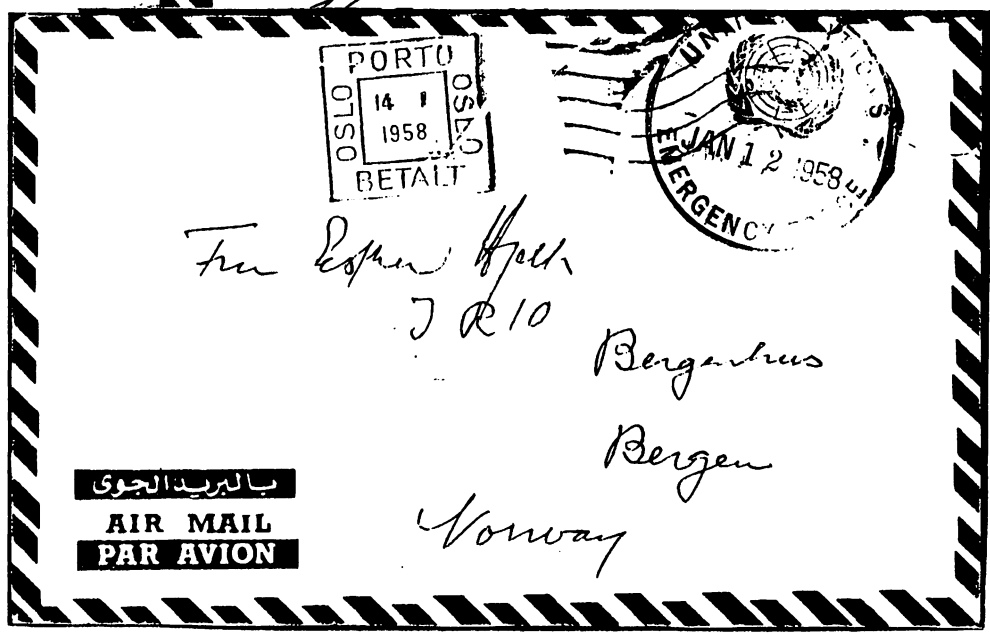
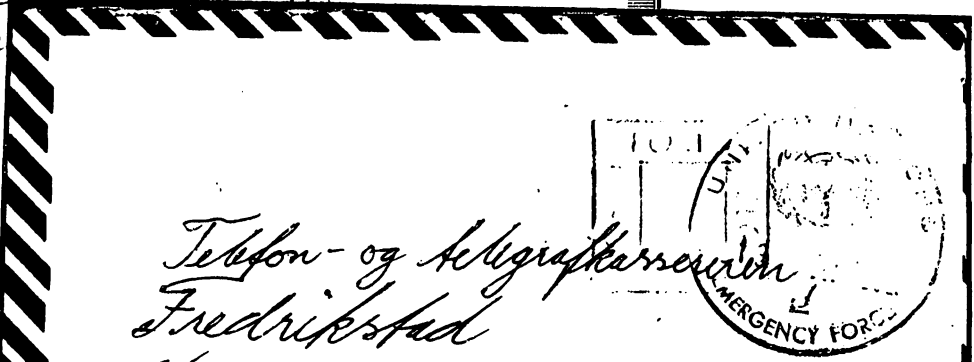


The Norwegian Contingent.

Norways mail always had an official UN cancel and a special squared cancel put on in Oslo 'Porto Betalt Oslo' which means post paid Oslo. It can be found in purple, greenish blue and black. The black has the date in the centre.

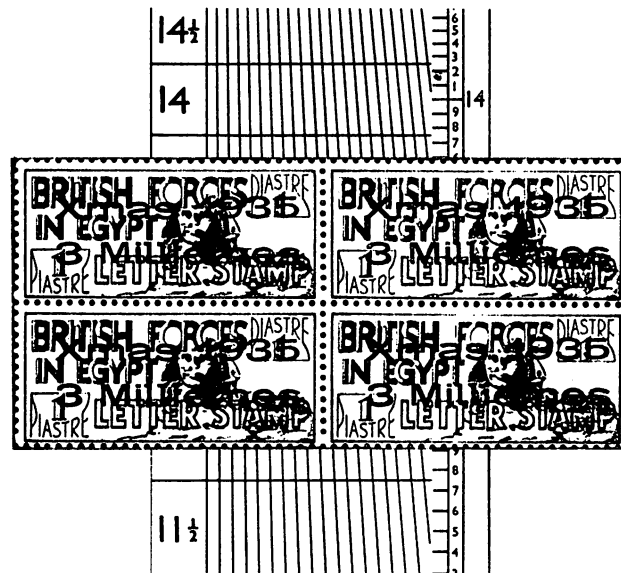
British Forces Letter Stamps - Perforation Find

Conversations with Stanley Horesh led me to carefully check the perforations on these Sphinx Letter Stamps and it would appear that the definitive publication on this issue is not 100% correct ! I found that those listed by Hobbs as being perf. 14, are in fact $13\frac{1}{2}$ x 14, just as Gibbons catalogue states ! It is fair to say that, using the Gibbons Instanta perforation gauge, the horizontal perfs. on those stamps tend to be at the higher end of the $13\frac{1}{2}$ box on the gauge and therefore quite close to 14. A chart of my findings is as follows :

It seems to me that, since all these A9 to A11 perfs. are the same, Hobbs' original measurement was out and he repeated the error issue by issue knowing that they were all the same as one another. I agree that that it does seem a fundamental mistake to have made and I'm amazed that nobody seems to have spotted it before. As the stamps do not need to be measured in order to differentiate, I have never measured mine before. So for once, the catalogue beats the specialised work !

Alexandria / Egypt Postmark

This striking postcard of the Pyramids, printed by Lehnert and Landrock's "successors" in Cairo, is intriguing not so much as a prime example of stamp echoing postcard design, but for its postmark, which I have not seen before. The Arabic in the upper half clearly says Alexandria; while the lower half has ALEXANDRIA / EGYPT. The date, unfortunately, is virtually illegible, and it is little more than a guess to suggest 1- JA 51. There is a characteristic buckling of the lower surface of the handstamp which should help identification - but the most worrying aspect is that the reverse of the card is as clean as the day it was printed. It has never passed through the post. So is the postmark a fake and the whole thing a fabrication, made in the early 1950s to capitalise on the growing re-emergence of tourism and collecting? Any ideas?

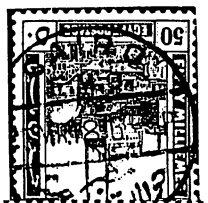


